



## Little Portage Area Van Trip

\*\*\*See red markings on maps indicating the best birding options at each location. Please note that you are not limited to these areas, they are just the areas we feel will be most productive.\*\*\*

### Possible Restroom Stops:

- Prior to Christy Farm – Head South on 19/Oak Harbor Road when you exit off of US6. You can find gas stations south of this intersection. To get to Christy Farm, go north on 19.
- After Christy Farm – There are a number of gas stations and restaurants at the intersection of US 6 and SR 53. Stop here before heading to McClure's Marsh
- There is a Sunoco Station on 53 between McClure's and Arnold's. This can be used both on the way to Arnold's from McClure and after Arnolds before heading to Harder's

### Christy Farm Nature Preserve

This private reserve is located on Muskellunge Creek. Primarily a riparian corridor the area also has a good amount of shrubland. The best area has been the area known as the Scout Cabin located off of Christy Road. It can be good for passerine migrants. Another area that shows promise is the shrub area off of SR 19. This should be good for field and shrub habitat birds. It is best to start the trip out here as the species sought tend to be best early in the morning before diffusing along the corridor towards the lake.

### McClure Marsh

This small private marsh has held good numbers of shorebirds over the years. Depending on water depth it may also be good for waders and waterfowl. Wetland passerines should be located on this area as well.

### Arnold's Marsh

This small private marsh lies against the famous Winous Point Shooting Club. While the wetlands are small and of average use this area seems to be a magnet for migrating passerines.

### Harder's Grasslands

This private area has been managed as a grassland for well over a decade. Bobolinks, Grasshopper Sparrow, and Eastern Meadowlark have been annual nesters. If they arrive in time Dicksissels have been consistent as well. Sedge Wren has been present on some years.
